Class Placements for 2025

Staff work very hard in Term 4 to place students in classes for the following year. You can read our Class Placement Policy and our Split Grade Policy on our website www.yangebupps.wa.edu.au. We try to ensure that each class has a range of abilities (split classes included) and that each student has at least one friend. If a student has been in a split class one year, if possible, they are put in a straight class the following year. It is important to understand that split classes are not organised based on ability (we favour independent students for these classes).

If there are any educational or behavioural issues that you think need to be brought to our attention before we place students, please let me know by email by **Friday 8th November** (andrea.macfarlane@education.wa.edu.au). Parents cannot request a particular teacher or not to be in a split class. Please note that we have not yet finalised allocating teachers to grades as yet. Students will have the opportunity to meet their new teacher for an hour on the last day of school and class lists will be posted in the library windows the day before. Students cannot be changed once classes are set because there are so many factors that go into the decisions so please do not ask for changes.

Open Night

Don't forget to come along to our annual Open Night next Thursday! Classrooms will be open from 4pm until 5.30pm. Following that, we would love families to stay on and enjoy a picnic on the school grounds. There will be some food vans available or you can bring your own picnic. You will also need to bring chairs or a picnic rug. This will be an alcohol free event. The school will close at 7.30pm.

Change to Student Reports

In order to reduce workload for teachers, the Education Department have advised us that we no longer include English and Maths comments on PP - Year 6 student reports. We will continue to give grades to all the areas as usual and write overall comments. School Board Meeting Summary - Term 4

The school board meets at least once each term and would like to provide our school community with updates from each meeting, during which we discuss school governance.

In term 4, highlights included updates from our principal, Andrea, who reported current enrolment at 309 students with growth expected next year. Kinder enrolments for 2025 remain open with positions still available. Maintenance updates included replacing the oval side fence, and events such as the Colour Run, Interschool Athletics, and School Open Night are scheduled.

The board endorsed the Book Lists and Fees and Charges for 2025. We also reviewed the financial position report. Adjustments in student reports were agreed to ease teacher workloads and align with WA reporting standards.

Our Deputy Principal, Richard, presented the latest NAPLAN results to the board, where we discussed the learning & support initiatives in place to continue improving results.

THE ONE ABOUT PARENTAL VIEWS ON FAILURE

THE STUDY

After experiencing a failure, children often look to their parents to see how they react. But what impact does their response have on their child's mindset? Parents can view failure as either "enhancing" or "debilitating". An enhancing view of failure sees setbacks as a chance to learn and grow, whereas a debilitating view of failure sees setbacks as a source of shame and forms the basis of a negative judgement on the child's ability.

Researchers from Stanford University ran a series of studies with over one hundred parent/child pairs in order to explore what impact parental mindsets and their view of failure had on the child's mindset. Their results offer guidance as to how parents can help young students develop a growth mindset (i.e. the belief that one can get better).

THE MAIN FINDINGS

- 1 Whether a parent had a fixed or a growth mindset **did not predict** their child's mindset.
- 2 Children were **very accurate** at assessing if their parents viewed failure as either potentially enhancing or debilitating.
- 3 Parents who viewed failure as **debilitating** were more likely to have a child with a fixed mindset.
- 4 Parents who viewed failure as **enhancing** were more likely to have a child with a growth mindset.
- 5 Out of all the parents, older ones were more likely to believe that failure could be a **helpful learning experience**.



As the authors of the study comment, "it may be that parents, like children, have mindsets that shape their own goals and behaviours, but that these beliefs are relevant to shaping children's beliefs only if they lead to practices that children pick up on".

They summarise by stating that "our findings indeed show that parents who believe failure is a debilitating experience have children who believe they cannot develop their intelligence ... these parents react to their children's failures by focusing more on their children's ability or performance than on their learning".


