Semester 1 Reports and Connect

The feedback we have received through Parent Representatives reaching out to you has been that some parents find Connect difficult to use and this is why so many reports and communications have not been read. The Education Department are currently trialling a new, much more comprehensive program which we are hoping will be available by the end of next year. This means that we need to stay with Connect in the meantime. Therefore, please do not hesitate to ask for help with using Connect or for a printed student report if you would like one. I will give you more details about the new program when we know more.

Student Reading

As a follow up to the last newsletter, I would like to emphasise not only how important it is that you read to your child, but also that your child reads regularly at home. Students who are still learning the phonic code need practice at sounding words out using sounds that they have learnt already. These books, called decodables, often seem easy but it is vital that students become fluent with the basic code of the English language. Rereading these books is a great way to become fluent. Once students are proficient with the English language sounds, they can move on to independent reading (usually some time in Year 2). It is still important that independent readers read aloud to parents at least weekly to ensure correct pronunciation and expression. Our fluency program in Years 3-6 supports this.



Excloper student each term Students perform calculations to learn about atoms, molecules, elements and compounds and progress to calculations in topics such as gases, specific heat and chemical solutions.
