

YANGBEUP PRIMARY SCHOOL Voluntary Contributions and Charges 2025

Dear Parents and Carers

The Education Act 1999 requires schools to notify parents and carers of all contributions and charges prior to the start of the school year. These costs are divided into three areas: Voluntary Contributions, Charges and Personal Use Items that have been endorsed by the Yangebup School Board.

- 1. **Voluntary Contributions** A voluntary contribution goes towards the cost of items used in the educational programs provided for your child.
- 2. **Charges** For extra cost optional items. A estimate of the costs of these items is listed for non-compulsory activities. Payments for these items is a condition of participation by students.
- 3. **Personal Use Items –** Items on this list are required for students use in their classrooms.

1. Voluntary Contributions (Kindergarten to Year 6)

The total amount of Voluntary Contributions parents and carers are being asked to pay is **\$60.00 per student**. This equates to approximately \$1.50 per week. While Contributions are voluntary, the quality of our teaching and learning program will be maximised when each family contributes to the cost of supplementing funding gained from other sources, including the State and Commonwealth governments. The school contributions will be used to purchase supplementary materials and resources used in classrooms.

Contributions collected at this school contribute to items for each student includes Literacy Resources, ICT Resources, Art and Craft Materials, Physical Educations/Sport, Mathematics, Science and Health materials and consumables.

Additional Voluntary Approved Request Chaplain - \$12 per student

2. Charges: Curriculum Related Activities

This amount can vary from year to year and from class to class. A breakdown of estimated charges for your child's participation in excursions/in-school activities etc. for 2025 has been outlined in the schedule below. The amounts indicated on the schedule represent the maximum charged for scheduled activities in 2025. **Students can only participate if they have parental permission and have paid the charge.** This money will be used to fund the following type of activities, *Visiting performers, excursions, interschool sport carnivals, swimming lessons and other special events.*

The activity charge can be paid in advance at the beginning of the year and any school performances that your child attend will be deducted from this amount. Any money left in your child's account at the end of 2025, will be carried forward into 2026.

3. Personal Use Items

The cost for these items will vary from year level to year level. It includes items such as pens, pencils and scrapbooks. Parents may purchase these items from their chosen retailer or use the nominated school supplier *Campion Education*. The school receives a small commission for each order processed through this company. From Years 2 to 6, a charge may apply for a Spelling Mastery Student Book/Initial Lit Book (year 2s only) if you are unable to purchase it from Campion Education.

You can pay your Voluntary Contributions of \$60 per student for 2025 through Campion Education when you order your child's Personal Use Items. This contribution can be paid at the school office at any time.

Charges – important notes (please read carefully)

- Charges must be paid prior to the planned activity. If personal circumstances result in payment difficulties, please contact the Manager of Corporate Services to make alternative arrangements.
- The charges vary from year level to year level depending on the nature and range of activities undertaken. The estimated costs indicated represent the maximum amounts that a parent/carer should anticipate being charged throughout the coming school year. Very few students, if any, participate in the full range of activities available. For example, only selected students participate in Music Programs and PEAC (Primary Extension and Challenge).

 Please note that the amounts indicated on the schedule represent the maximum that could be charged for scheduled activities in 2025.
